

At a meeting on October 22, 1986, with Judge Oakes,
the following was suggested:

- a) The Second Circuit Bicentennial Committee should undertake to co-sponsor an evening forum with and at the Association of the Bar of the City of New York. The topic would relate to The Courts and the Constitution. We should solicit 2-3 speakers to participate.

The chairpersons of the Subcommittee on Public Education and Subcommittee on Special Projects are invited to decide which of the two Subcommittees should consider this project and, if approved by the Subcommittee, promptly contact Justin Feldman, Esq. of the Association (who has indicated to Judge Oakes a willingness to join in such a co-sponsored event) to arrange a suitable date and other details.

- b) It has been suggested that perhaps Judge Motley personally would be willing to contact Congressman James Scheuer to determine if he can arrange to obtain several thousand copies of House Document No. 94-508, The Constitution of the United States of America, for limited distribution to school children.
- c) The chairperson of each of the three Subcommittees is requested to submit to the Steering/Coordinating Subcommittee an estimated lump-sum budget request.
- d) Judge Oakes will ask Steve Flanders to draft suitable letterhead and stationery for the Second Circuit Bicentennial Committee.
- e) Judge Oakes will be meeting shortly with the Subcommittee on Funding to discuss our funding needs.

If I receive no comments or objection from any of you by noon on Wednesday, October 29, 1986 I will assume your approval of the above for further action.

As a separate matter, will you let me know if we should seek a budget allocation and, if so, please suggest an amount. This was discussed previously but I thought I should ask again.
