Pursuant to Part 146, court-based mediation rosters require both a combination of mediation training and experience mediating. In addition, some courts may require additional training and experience beyond Part 146's requirements. Acceptance on court rosters depends on a court's need for mediators at any given time and may include a court's need for mediators with specific case-type training or experience.

**This training will be offered online over a period of four weekday afternoons.**

This course is approved under Part 146 by the New York State Unified Court System's Office of ADR Program and satisfies Part 146 requirements, with at least 16 hours of advanced mediation training.
