2391 - MORAN - for defendant - direct

Q: How long was your interview in March of 1969?

A: Approximately one hour.

Q: And at that time did you give a statement to Mr. Gallina

A: Yes, I did.

Q: What was the substance of the statement to Mr. Gallina?

A: That my brother, Michael, and William Maynard were at my home, at my mother's house, on the weekend of April 2

Q: And were you ever called down again to the District Atty
;s office?

A: No, I wasnt.

2400 - MORAN - for defendant - cross

Q: Now, had Mr. Maynard stayed over at your mother's house on any other occasion other than Sunday, April 2d.?

A: No, at Christmas time was the only other time.

Q: ... Is that that you simply don't recall any other occasion, or are you prepared to say that he did not, to your knowledge, stay over any other time but April 3d and Christmas?

A: I'm practically positive that he never stayed over.

COURT: ...

Do I understand you correctly that you told the d.a. that it was possible that it might have been another weekend, but that you were practically sure it was the weekend of April 2, 1967; is that your testimony?

WITNESS: Yes. That in May of 1967, when the incident first arose about the whereabouts of my brother Michael Quin and William Maynard I was positive he was at our home. Two years later when I was questioned in March, 1969 he questioned me as to the -- how could I be so sure of this and finally -- he said, could it be possible. So I said, "Well, it could be possible but I was practically positive." Because in May, '67 that's what I remember.
