Dear Mr. Stotyn:

I represent Mr. Maynard, whom I understand visited your office in connection with obtaining entry into Canada.

Apparently, Mr. Maynard was denied entry into Black Pool, Quebec on March 15, 1978 on the ground that he had been convicted of homicide. I believe that Mr. Maynard has presented your office with a certificate from the County Clerk's office of the Supreme Court, New York County, which states that the homicide charges against Mr. Maynard were dismissed on August 24, 1974.

As I represented Mr. Maynard in his homicide case, I am writing this letter to shed additional light on what happened with regard to the case in question. Mr. Maynard was convicted of manslaughter on December 9, 1970, and sentenced on the basis of that conviction to a term of ten to twenty years in state prison on January 12, 1971. In 1974, the defense discovered evidence which had not been presented to the jury which convicted Mr. Maynard. Based on this evidence, a motion for a new trial was made to the Supreme Court of the State of New York. On March 29, 1974, this motion was granted, and Mr. Maynard's conviction was vacated. For your records, I am enclosing a copy of the decision of Justice Irving Lang, granting Mr. Maynard a new trial. This decision is officially reported at 80 Misc.2d 279.

Once Mr. Maynard was granted a new trial, he was restored to his full rights and presumed innocent of the crime. Shortly thereafter he was admitted to bail. As the Clerk's certificate which has been presented to you indicates, on August 24, 1974, the homicide charges against Mr. Maynard were dismissed. Thus, under American law Mr. Maynard was fully vindicated.

I am sure that all of the above can be verified, if necessary, by checking with the District Attorney's office which was responsible for handling Mr. Maynard's case. For your convenience, the address is :
