Mounting deaths and casualties in ongoing conflicts and situations in Ukraine, Myanmar, Ethiopia, and other nations have been described as crimes against humanity. While the global legal framework has treaties that specifically address genocide, war crimes, torture, and other atrocities, none exists for crimes against humanity. After years of delay, member states of the United Nations recently voted to move forward the process of finalizing and adopting a draft treaty on crimes against humanity.





In her lecture, Akila Radhakrishnan,
President of the Global Justice Center,
will give an overview of crimes against
humanity, describe the draft treaty to
address and prevent that atrocity, talk
about the diplomatic process of adopting it,
and discuss its effects on international law.
