The above-named witnesses will testify to the best of their knowledge that the defendant herein arrived at premises 51-34 30th Avenue, Woodside, Queens, New York, at about six o'clock in the evening of April 2nd, 1967, and remained in said premises until the following morning, April 3rd, 1967, and left said premises at about 8:00 A.M., on April 3rd, 1967, in the company of Michael Quinn.

3. The defendant, together with all of the above-named witnesses, had dinner at the premises aforementioned in the evening of April 2nd, 1967.
