2387 - MORAN - for defendant - direct

Q: And what else were you told by Mr. Gallina?

A: They showed me a -- he showed me a bag, and he said that it was found at the scene of the crime, and William Maynard's fingerprints were on it.

Q: And that bag you make reference to, I show you People's 21 in Evidence, and I ask you whether or not this is the bag Mr. Gallina showed you?

A: Yes, it is.

Q: And he had said that Mr. Maynard's fingerprints were on this bag?

A: Yes, he did.

2577 - ELIZ QUINN - for defendant - direct - SUMMARY

(grand jury subpoena)

Summoned by detectives on MArch 12, 1969.

Before 8:00 am.

Went down to Gallinas offic³. Was with Patrick, Kathy and Richard. Richard wasnt supoenad, he just came along.

Driven downtown by Det O'Brien and Hanast.

And she never appeared before any grand jury, after questioning they were allowed to go home.

2595

Q: Now, during the course of your interview with Mr. Gallina, were you ever--that would be in March of 1969--were you ever shown a handbag, which is now marked as Peopals Exhibit 21 in evidence (handing handbag to witness) Please look at this.

A: Yes, he showed me that handbag.

Q: And ~~what~~ did he say about this handbag, if anything?

A: He told me that handbag was dropped at the scene of the crime, and that Mr. Maynard's fingerprints were on it.

2586 - QUINN - defendant - direct

ELIZ

Q: Now, after your interview concluded with Mr. Gallina on March 12, 1969, did Mr. Gallina ever submit to you a typewritten statement?

A: No.

Q: Were you ever asked to sign anything on March 12, 1969?

A: No.

Q: Do you know about how long your son, Michael, and Giselle were in civil jail?

A: Two weeks.

Q: And during that 2-week period, were you ever permitted to visit with them?

A: No.

Q: Were you ever permitted to make any phone calls to them?

A: No.

Q: Did they ever make any phone calls to you?

A: No.

Q: You said Michael and Giselle, to your knowledge, were in a civil jail for about two weeks. Do you know whether

or not they were released after the two weeks?

A: They were released and came to my home. When they came home they were in a state of collapse; they were ill, they were thin, they were wrecked.--

2619 - ELIZ QUINN - for defendant - cross (SUMMARY)

Sawyer asked whether she signed an affidavit given to her by her son Michael in Feb of 1968.

The affidavit says that Michael and Maynard spent night of April 2d ~~xxx~~ at son's Patrick's house who takes care of me, and left next morning on April 3, 1967.

Executed affidavit for Mr. Samuel Segal who was atty for Maynard.

Affidavit also says that she was asked whether she signed the Segal affidavit out of fear that Michael was involved?

And she says in affidavit that she did.

2560 - ELIZABETH QUINN (MOTHER) _ for defendant -direct

(SUMMARY)

Mrs. Elizabeth Quinn lived in Woodside Queens for 31 years.
Lived at present address for 15 years.

Age 63

Four children, Patrick, Mary, Michael and Kathy.

Widow, since 1958.

Has some grandchildren too.

2620 - ELIZ QUINN - for defendant - cross

Q: At that time, due to pressure put upon me, and taking my son in jail, telling him that he may stay ~~xxx~~ in there until Christmastime, and Giselle was going to be deported, under that, yes. I did not know what that man was going to do.

Q: Was your son in civil jail at the time you signed this statement, Mrs^w Quinn?

...
A: No.

Q: No. He was right in the room, was he not?

A: Right. -- He could put him back.

Q: But I am asking you, Mrs. Quinn: At the time you made this statement and initialed each page, signed it and swore to the truth of it, was it true or was it not true?

A: It was due to pressure put upon me, that that came to my

mind, and this is why the statement was signed.

2621 - ELIA QUINN - for defendant - CROSS

Q: Now, were you asked the further question and did you give the following further answer:

QUESTION: Now, on Sunday, April 2d thru Monday, April 3d, 1967, do you know where William Anthony Maynard was?

ANSWER: I do not know.

QUESTION: This is 67, of course?

ANSWER: Yes.

Do you recall being asked that question and giving those answers?

A: Yes, Because I assumed I had to give a yes or no answer, without an explanation. If I had a doubt in my mind then, I did not know Mr. Maynard was at my home.

Q: Well, did you have a doubt in your mind, Mrs. Quinn?

A: This proves it (indicating statement). He put that doubt into my mind under severe pressure. He held my son over me.

2628 - ELIZ QUINN - for defendant - cross

COURT: Did you tell the judge, that you were under pressure and --

A: I was afraid to talk -

COURT: You were afraid to talk?

A: I didnt know that I could explain myself, I said I thought I just had to give a yes, no, and I couldnt sit and talk like this to you.

COURT: Were you--

A: I was very upset, after Michael being in jail, they said he will be released around Christmas time, and they are going to deport Giselle. I was just a wreck.

2641-2- ELIZ QUINN - for defendant - cross

Giselle and Michael were living in a resident hotel in March and April of 69.

Doesnt recall police asking here as to where they were during Feb, Mar, Apr of 69.

Doesnt recall telling police she didnt know where they were but when they'd call here she would relay a message.

Actually they came over every Sunday.

She doesnt recall the police making inquiry for Michael at her home.

She doesnt recall the police stopping my and her saying that she doesnt know where he is living, but if he comes by or phones she will give a message.
