HEALTH COVERAGE OPEN ENROLLMENT

NYLS is conducting a health coverage election open enrollment from April 29th through May 15th. Full-time faculty and staff members who are eligible for coverage under the School's plans have the option of choosing between the traditional Blue Cross Hospitalization and TIAA Major Medical plans and a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO).

This year, in addition to U.S. Healthcare, several other HMOs will be available. These include Healthnet (Blue Cross HMO), Healthways and Oxford Health Plan. Election to change coverage must be made by May 15th for a change in coverage effective July 1st. Brochures for the different plans are available in the Personnel Office.

SPECIAL SERVICES TO STUDENTS FOR THE READING AND EXAMINATION PERIODS

NYLS will provide the following services beginning Friday, May 1, 1987 and continuing through Friday, May 22, 1987:

Extended Library Hours/Late Night Study Hall

The Law School's Library hours will be extended. In addition, the first and second floors of the 53 Worth Street Library will be available every night as a Study Hall for several hours after the Library closes. This space is for study purposes only; no library personnel will be available to assist you. There will be a NYLS guard on duty who will ask you to present your validated NYLS I.D. at the time the study hall opens. Students must be in the library when it closes in order to stay on for the study hall. Students will not be allowed to re-enter the study hall once they leave the building.

Student Parking in Law School's Parking Lot

After presenting a validated NYLS I.D., students will be permitted to park in the Parking Lot on a first-come, first-served basis from Friday, May 1st through Friday, May 22nd as follows:

SOUTHERN DISTRICT LITIGATION PROGRAM 1987-88

The United States District Court for the Southern District of New York is once again sponsoring a Litigation Training Program for third-year, full-time and fourth-year, part-time law students. The program is intended to give these law students some insight into the practice of litigation. The primary requisite for participation in the program is the student's sincere interest in specializing in litigation.

Approximately 52 law firms are participating in the program and range in size from single practitioners to some of the largest law firms in New York City and Westchester County. The student is required to work at the law firm for 15 hours per week during the academic year 1987-88. Each student will be paid an hourly salary which is set by the individual employer and a schedule that is mutually satisfactory to both the law firm and the student will be worked out.

Interested students should submit a resume to **Ms. Kathleen Corke**, 57 Worth Street, 2nd floor as soon as possible but not later than Wednesday, May 6th. Resumes will be forwarded to a Committee which will screen the candidates on the basis of their resumes. Those candidates that are qualified will meet with a member of the Committee for an interview. Law students accepted into the program will be matched on a random basis with one of the participating law firms. An interview at the law firm is also required.
