A: Yes, we had a conversation with Mr. Gallina

A: He went over again the weekend of April 2 and April 3, and also the circumstances under which Maynard left, and w when I gave my answers he committed ;me to civil jail.

Q: And you say that evening you were taken before a Judge?

A: Yes.

Q: Were you represented by an atty at that tiame?

A: I ;had an atty, but I wasnt allowed to call him.

A: Yes.

- Q: Well, what did Mr. Gallina say to you the day before May 8th, 1969?
- A: He said tat Giselle would be deported, and that we could look forward to being in there at least until December, both of us, in Civil jail, or her being deported in the meantime, and myself staying in there unt il the hearing came up, and he had also told me that if I ;did give this testimony he would take care of that other charge that I had, you know, regarding the auto. That been haging over my head for 3 years. He said that would be wiped off the books.

2: And while you were in civil jail, did you ever further ask Mr. Gallina permission to call a lawyer?

A: On numerous occasions.

2: And were you ever permitted to make such a phone call?

A: I was permitted to make no phone call except to Mr. Gal Lina.

Q: Now, would you tell us why in May 87h, 1969, you gave Mr. Gallina the statment that has been read here today?

A: I did it for a few reasons. One, to pretect Giselle from being deported. Another to get out of Civil jail. Another was to get that case that Ive never been pros ecuted for for 3 years, to get it wiped off the books.

Q: When you testified at the prior proceedings that Mr. Sawyer had made reference to in the crooss examination, did you have any understanding with Mr. Gallina as to what your testimony was to be at that proceeding

A: Yes, I did have an "nderstanding with Mr. Gallina.

Q: Ex Will you tell us what the understanding was add how it came about?

A: Well, the nderstanding was that I was to make the stat ment that I made in May 8th, I believe, and then at the hearing, I would, to certain questions I would make cer tain responses, and I would continue in that vein of the statement I made in May when I was first released from civil jail. 2290 - MIKE - fedir

COURT: ... You knew, did you not, that you were going to testify at this hearing?

A: Yes, I did.

CO&RT: That's right.

Q: And that knowing that, you had made a certain agreement with Mr. Gallina as to what testimony you would give?

A: Yes, in that way I was protected.

COURT: Do you mind telling me what he said about your tell ing a lie on the stand?

A: He would say when they ask you if -- you have been promised anything -- if you have been threatened in any way, that you have to deny this; that you have to pass over the fact that you were held in civil jail and see it our way. See if afrom our point of view.

COURT: What else did he tell you about what you were supposed to testify to?

WITNESS: He had more or less rehearsed me--

COURT: In what aespect? What did he say he wants you to tell the court and jury?

A: He wants me to be an impotent witness for the defense.

WITNESS: He prepared in -- told me some of the questions that would be asked me in the trail.

COURT: Go ahead. Tell us what they were.

A: He told me specifically the question that the defense atty wouldpose to me in the form of being threatened or promised something, altho he promised to wipe off that other case for me. He told me I would have to say no to this.

WITNESS: Was I shocked? I was pretty much in shock after 2 weeks in civil jail

Q: When you tesitifed at the -- at a June, 1969 hearing, were you ; in --

COURT: What?

Q: (CONTG) -- in fear -- in fear when you gave your testimon; y?

A: Yes, I was.

Q: Would you explain tht?

A: Well, I was in fear because I was testifying against a man I knew to be with me that evening and I was testifying because -- you know -- in that manner because he had a lot -- you know, he was going to do a lot to me if I didnt. He was going to deport Giselle if I didnt

Q: Now during the two weeks that you were in Civil jail, did you ever see your mother or your brothers?

A: No, we werent permitted to phone anyone, to call any one, it was just thru a friendly guard who made the phone call for us to get our toilet articles down there to the civil jail, but otherwise they wouldnt have known where we were. No one would have known where we were.
