Syracuse Hearing Key Takeaways: The Syracuse public hearing took place on October 26, 2021, and only had three testifiers. There were concerns raised about keeping districts competitive, gerrymandering, and keeping communities whole.

Organizations Named:

- Orleans County Democrats

Communities of Concern and Specific Issues:

- Cortland and Otsego: keep counties competitive
- Madison, Cortland, and Otsego: keep counties together to maintain a competitive district; keep separate from Syracuse
- Oswego: keep whole within single districts
