11/20/72

Maynard came back to Greenhaven on 11/16/72. Signed a paper to be put into protective custody. Authorities put him in a place called seg. Wanted to get out.

Wrote a letter on 11/17 to get out. The next day Maynard saw Sgt Hughes, signed 3 papers to be released. Told he would be moved. Has not been.

Wants most vehemently to be out of there. Into an idle company. Same as before.

Spoke to Lt Prouse in Maynard's presence. Prouse agreed that Maynard

had a right to object to being
