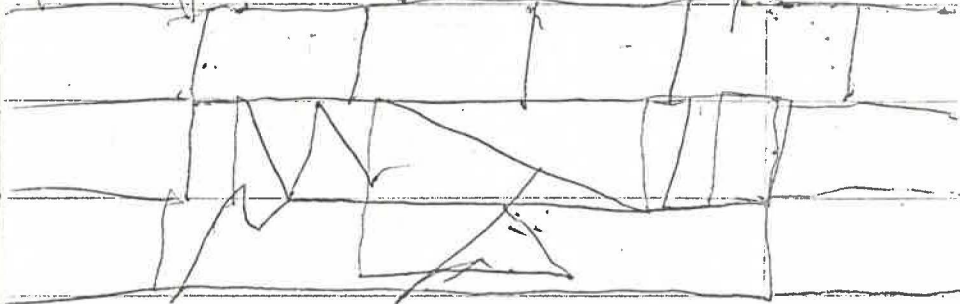

Subject : Follow Up Interviews Donald DiBrienza (Witness)

On May 20, 1967 Det. Planaker, Duncon, Daily received a telephone call from Donald DiBrienza (D.D.5 189) who stated he witnessed the Kroil Homicide and saw the perpetrator in a park at West 4th and 6th Ave. The above named Det. responded immediately and toured the area with DiBrienza without results.

The assigned with Lieut. Stone and Det. Hanast interviewed the witness and received the following statements. He (DiBrienza) lives at 440 60th street B'klyn but was moving to 50 Skillman Ave Jersey City. He was employed as a drummer at the Redwood Lounge Hoboken, N.J. He claimed he served in the Marine Corp in Viet Nam assigned the 82nd Airborne (Army) as a qualified Para-Chutist. He was wounded and returned home and discharged. (Exceptional Military Service) He did not come forward immediately as he did not want to get involved. A secret check on this subject's Military background shows he was never a member of the Marine Corp or Reserve. His version of the shooting completely differed with four other witnesses.
