

your recalcitrant writer been in keep-lock nearly since my last
writing but (no-sweat) I am together! I am enclosing papers for
the record....

I've been trying to get my teeth cleaned with no results, I've
written the Warden several times no response is there something you
can do concerning my teeth (I'm writing to the commission; in October
it will be 4 years without dental care) maybe at that writing you can
also ask if I can be transferred to another prison, any greenhau
the closer to the city, the grounds can be perogative to hardship (visit etc.)

THIS LETTER IS RETURNED TO YOU BECAUSE!

1. You did not sign properly.
2. You did not fill out stub properly.
3. Name of addressee has not been approved.
4. Letters addressed to General Delivery not permitted.
5. It contains Criminal or Institutional News.
6. Begging for packages or money not allowed.
7. You are not permitted to receive the articles requested.
8. The articles requested can only be received new from dealer.
9. Correspondence with newspapers or newspaper employees not permitted.
10. You cannot have a visit with the person named in your letter unless approved by the Superintendent.
11. Inmate who wrote letter for you did not sign his name.
12. Special Letters must not be submitted Saturday, Sunday, or Holidays.
13. You did not stick to your subject.
14. You have no stamps on deposit.

As you will; the aforesaid may seem minuscule but it would seem that "they" instead of their give-used must do attitude toward their so-called authority in rules etc., would attend to business like 'mental & proper food' etc. What I'm trying to say is that of all the prisons in N.Y. State is the most oppressive in fact the more ways you add is something to not be believed there has been a number of shoot-outs with guards with the prisoners (fights) a number of them were brought from Auburn and still are being brought here from there; they part time consist of practicing martial arts Karate, Judo etc. the guards at various times provoke incidents which seem to be increasing; aside from the usual peeping, stabbings usually done by older inmates in black & white confrontations usually older white are the recipients of the type of doings.

Now I've been allowed to get commissary although in less lock where I've secured, Moten, Wheatgene & vitamins; Honey I they have been giving me milk daily for some weeks now as a consequence I'm really feeling really together & stronger. Hopeful that this time found you in harmony & strength. Please do give my regards to all with my continued thanks & appreciation for these efforts and help.
