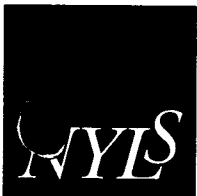

RUSSIAN SECURITIES MARKETS SYMPOSIUM

The Center for International Law will present a symposium, titled "The Russian Securities Markets: Regulation and Practice," on **Monday, November 18**, from 2 to 5 p.m. in the Ernst Stiefel Reading Room. It will focus on the development of the securities markets in Russia, as well as external demand for and sale of Russian securities. The guest speakers will discuss the recent development of a regulatory framework for the Russian securities markets and describe examples of privatization.

The four speakers are: Richard P. Bernard, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, New York Stock Exchange, Inc.; Galina Shilina, Manager, International Privatization Group/Corporate Finance, Price Waterhouse, Moscow; Thomas D. Sanford, Vice President, The Bank of New York; and Elena L. Daly, Associate, Cleary, Gottlieb, Steen & Hamilton -- New York, Moscow and London. Following their presentations the speakers will answer questions from the audience. The event will be hosted by Sydney M. Cone, III, C.V. Starr Professor of the Law of International Trade and Finance and Director of the NYLS Center for International Law.

Faculty Activities

On October 24-26 the Association of American Law Schools held a workshop on evidence entitled "New Perspectives on Scientific and Character Evidence." **Professor Randolph Jonakait** acted as a moderator and discussion leader at the workshop and served on planning committee for it.

On October 28, **Professor Nadine Strossen** taught a legal studies class on civil liberties and gave a public lecture on "Censorship on the Internet" at the University of Massachusetts in Amherst. On October 29, she was filmed for the TV series "The Telecommunications and Information Revolution" on the topic of "ACLU v. Reno, The Internet Case; Who's Right — the ACLU or the Government?" (She debated Bruce Taylor, President of the National Law Center for Children and Families.) Strossen was also filmed for a videotape being produced by the Benton Foundation on campaign finance reform,

discussing constitutional issues presented by various reform proposals. On October 30, Strossen was interviewed on ABC-TV's World News Program, on civil liberties in the presidential election. She also debated Wheelock College Professor Gail Dine on women and pornography at Boston College. On October 31, Strossen lectured at the University of Richmond Law School's Legal Forum. She contributed two chapters to a newly-published book: *Pornography: Opposing Viewpoints* (Carol Wekesser, Editor) (Greenhaven Press, San Diego, CA 1997).

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR....

ATTENTION FIRST YEAR STUDENTS, TRANSFER STUDENTS, NEWLY ADMITTED VISITING STUDENTS AND FOREIGN LAWYERS --

At the time you were admitted to New York Law School, you received information concerning post-secondary immunization requirements. In order to be in compliance with New York State Public Health Law 2165, you must submit proof of immunization as follows:

- Two dates of vaccines against measles
- One date of a mumps vaccine
- One date of a rubella vaccine

This documentation (certified by a physician or health care practitioner) should have been submitted to the Office of the Registrar by September 26.

As of this date, there are several students who have not yet submitted the required documentation. Notices will be sent out to all of these students and placed in mailfolders. Please check your mail-folders each day. **This documentation MUST be submitted to the Registrar by November 25.**

Please remember that if a student is not in compliance with Public Health Law 2165, or does not present acceptable evidence of compliance, **New York Law School is required to refuse to allow the student to continue in attendance.**
