## Professor Carlin Meyer Granted Tenure

The Board of Trustees voted at its meeting on Tuesday, December 6, to promote Professor Carlin Meyer to the position of full Professor with tenure at New York Law School. Since 1988. Professor Meyer has been an Associate Professor of Law at NYLS where she teaches Employment Law, Evidence, Family Law, Feminist Jurisprudence, and Lawyering Theory. Previously, she served as Assistant Attorney General in Charge and Bureau Chief, Labor Bureau, Office of the Attorney General, New York State Department of Law (1983-1987). She was also an Adjunct Professor of Law at NYU School of Law in 1983 and 1984. She has had numerous articles published on employment law, federal jurisdiction, and women's rights, including "Sex, Sin, and Women's Liberation: Against Porn-Suppression" (Texas Law Review, April 1994) and "Abstentation Doctrine and the Civil Rights Plaintiff: Let the Lawyer Beware" in the Civil Rights Litigation and Attorney Fees Handbook, (Barbara Wolvovitz, ed., 1988).

Professor Karen Gross was appointed as the Southeastern Bankruptcy Law Institute's Distinguished Visitor for 1995. She will spend 10 days in the Atlanta area speaking to law students, law professors, lawyers, and judges about bankruptcy topics. She was also appointed to the Second Circuit's Gender Bias Task Force and as co-chair of the bankruptcy subcommittee (with retired Judge Cecelia Goetz). Professor Gross

will be making a presentation at the AALS meeting, to be held January 4–8 in New Orleans, on bankruptcy and feminism for the new section on Scholarly Research and Development.

On November 28, Adjunct Professor Anne S.

Haskell delivered a lecture entitled "The Failure of Modernization and the Contemporary Welfare State" at a leadership training program sponsored by the Fundación Ortega y Gasset at the University Complutense of Madrid. In addition, she has been nominated to the Committee on Sex and Law of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York and to the Committee on Accreditation and Academic Standards Committee of the Legal Writing Institute.


